The Cover Art: In 1896, James Tissot published a collection of 350 watercolors depicting the life of Jesus, garnering widespread acclaim. Known for painting urban life in Paris and London, Tissot's ambitious project chronicled Gospel events with remarkable detail, taking nearly a decade to complete. He traveled to Egypt, Syria, and Palestine, observing landscapes, architecture, and attire, while consulting rabbis and studying theological texts. Believing in the lingering "aura" of Gospel sites, Tissot described mystical experiences that deepened his work, aiming to create an eyewitness-like account of Jesus's life.


