INTRODUCTION



Like last year's Annual Report, this year's report is organized by Micah's three-fold summary of God's expectations. The report not only gives examples of how we have done justice, loved kindness, and walked humbly with God over the past year, but also serves to encourage us to continue our purpose and mission as a faith community in the coming year.

Micah challenges us to keep questioning how will we work for fairness and equality for all, particularly the weak and powerless? How will we ensure love, loyalty, and faithfulness are the cornerstones of our relationships? How will we consider our life's journey with circumspect rather than with knee-jerk reactions? And how will we carefully put Christ first in all the moments of our lives?

"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" Micah 6:8




DO JUSTICE

SERVE one another, our community, and the world with humility and love, relying on the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to lead us in witnessing to the love of God in Jesus Christ.

FPC continued its strong partnerships with organizations that serve those in need. For Habitat for Humanity, we increased participation by the congregation, supported the establishment of a youth council, and initiated youth build days. We also promoted International Neighbors to the congregation and increased funding; began an initiative to publicize "bite-size" service opportunities to the congregation via a monthly COC email; donated money from our discretionary fund to PACEM for the purchase of new sleeping cots and gave PACEM guests backpacks filled with items collected from members; provided volunteer and financial support for the Blue Ridge House Dinner; donated gifts and time for the CALM Christmas Store; organized a collection of personal items for Love, INC. during Lent, with hopes of continuing this activity every Lent; donated \$15,000 to IRIS toward the purchase of a retinal microscope using endowment funds; directed "5 Cents a Meal" donations to the local food banks; served Soup Kitchen weekly; sent a group to McClure, Virginia to serve through the Binns-Counts Community Center; gave money to Shelter for Help in Emergency (SHE) through a Quilt Sowers fundraiser; and more.



NURTURE our faith in Jesus Christ through education and fellowship, growing in wisdom, and deepening our relationship with God and one another.


Fellowship is an integral part of life of First Pres. As part of our fellowship together, we held spring and fall churchwide picnics and an Advent workshop dinner. Various groups and individuals hosted Sunday Fellowship Time and Lemonade on the Lawn.

New member classes were held in the spring and fall to invite those interested in membership to learn more about the church and discern whether or not they would like to join. Twenty-nine people joined this past year -- 25 adults and four confirmands.

Additional ministries nurtured and supported members and the larger community: Biannual Blood Drive, Bereavement Ministry, Card Ministry, Flower Delivery, Prayer Team, 30 Minutes of Care, Transportation, Visitation, and more.







Children's Ministry

Godly Play curriculum was introduced for Grades K-5, giving children an opportunity to respond to faith stories in a meaningful way.

Other faith development opportunities included the summer musical, Summer Story Time, Parenting in the Pew Class and Resource, Lent in a Box, Lenten devotions for Children and Families, Hanging of the Greens, Jesse Tree Advent learning, and giving of Bibles to kindergarteners and third graders.

The young age of the children did not prevent them from serving their church and community. They engaged in Soup Kitchen prep, Loaves and Fishes projects, International Neighbor family events, and a Halloween party with youth at Riverdale Assisted Living.







Youth Ministry

FPC Youth continued to deepen their faith through study, worship, and discussion, and share their faith in the community through service. They participated in the 30-hour Famine, care packages for college friends, lemonade and brownies on the Downtown Mall after the August 12 events, desserts for Soup Kitchen, PACEM, and the Pilgrimage weekend in Washington, D.C.

Fellowship and faith growing opportunities included Montreat, Sunday Youth Group, mid-week morning devotionals, Senior Celebration, and more. More than 25 youth led a meaningful service on Youth Sunday in May.

First Pres members, regular attendees, and guests worshiped together on Sunday mornings and participated in other opportunities at special times throughout the year, including prayer stations on Ash Wednesday and a supper and service on Ash Wednesday. Various activities enhanced the beauty and meaning of worship, including Hanging of the Greens for the Advent season and palms and lilies for the Easter season. More than 200 volunteers supported worship at First Pres, including communion servers and preparers, chancel teams, greeters, musicians, and more.

In March, the Worship Committee merged with the Evangelism Committee to become the Welcome and Worship Committee, in an effort to better partner in inviting people in the community to join us in worship and related activities.







Music at First Pres




