





Improvements of children's play areas





Connecting on Park Street Faith Grows Here

The project is laid out in several phases according to highest priority needs and available funding. Phase One is well underway to make some needed upgrades in the Preschool and Sunday School area on the lower level. The groundbreaking for this took place on Sunday, May 5. Work is expected to be complete by the time the children return to class.

The timeline for Phase Two has not been determined. This phase will address the upgrades to some of our mechanical systems and then construction of the addition on the back corner for an elevator, new office space, and additional classroom and music rehearsal spaces.

Later phases will include the new welcoming space between the Sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall as well as parking and landscaping.

To date, we have raised just over \$2 million. We are halfway there! We are grateful to those who have already given and pledged to the Campaign. Our leaders on the session and the diaconate have supported the campaign with their pledges and gifts. In addition, we have received gifts and pledges of all sizes from the congregation. If you have not made a pledge yet, please thoughtfully and prayerfully consider how you might participate with a gift. Every gift/pledge is valuable because what's important is that you have participated.








Do Justice

SERVE one another, our community, and the world with humility and love, relying on the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to lead us in witnessing to the love of God in Jesus Christ.

Relying on the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to lead us in witnessing to the love of God in Jesus Christ, FPC continued its loyal partnerships with organizations that serve those in need. For Habitat for Humanity, we continued monthly participation by the congregation and continued the growth of a youth council with one of our youth members. We also focused on efforts on communicating "bite-size" outreach opportunities to the congregation through a monthly COC email, connecting members to our mission partners in order to build relationships with the organizations with which we have financial commitments.

With the direction and discernment of members of the Christian Outreach Committee, we donated money from our discretionary fund to support initiatives such as Bibles for middle school students of Abundant Life Ministries (ALM), the new ID program in Charlottesville, and Habitat's Southwood project.


We assessed and have ongoing relationships with seven local area non-profits whom we call our mission partners, including a new relationship with Abundant Life Ministries as one of partners. We held a church-wide Outreach Fair on August 25 in order to bring awareness and to educate our members on the who/what/whys of our mission partners, the organizations prayerfully chosen as our partners in loving our neighbors in Charlottesvville and beyond, both with volunteers from our church as well as a financial commitment. In addition to those seven, we also support the First Pres Preschool, Presbytery of the James, Montreat Conference Center, and Mission Support for projects that involve our congregation members, such as the SWVA mission project with Binns County Community Center. With dedicated endowment funds for mission and benevolence, we have supported AIM and PACEM's new Secure Seniors Initiative. Our church has continued its relationship with Blue Ridge House for the annual Thanksgiving meal, provided gifts and time for the ALM Christmas Store for our annual Advent project, and organized a collection of personal items for Love, INC. for our annual Lent project. We have continued to direct our "5 Cents a Meal" donations to the local food banks; served Soup Kitchen weekly; supported members to serve the needs of those in McClure, Virginia; volunteered at ALM's Vacation Bible School, and continue to do more. The COC has evolved into a team who is focused on communicating and connecting First Pres members to our mission partners for the purpose of intentional engagement and building relationships with the very people whom we support beyond the dollar commitments.






NURTURE our faith in Jesus Christ through education and fellowship, growing in wisdom, and deepening our relationship with God and one another.




New member classes were held in the spring and fall to invite those interested in membership to learn more about the church and discern whether or not they would like to join. Eighteen people joined this past year.

A Good Samaritan intergenerational event, the Palm Sunday "Walk Through Holy Week," and an outdoor Easter Egg Hunt were school-year highlights.






















Youth Ministry















Walk Humbly with God

WORSHIP God faithfully and joyfully, prayerfully seeking God's direction for our lives.




More than 200 volunteers supported Welcome and Worship at First Pres, including communion servers and preparers, chancel teams, ushers, greeters, musicians, and more.
























Music at First Pres


