INTRODUCTION

In the coming year at First Pres, we will again focus on a theme from the prophet Micah, in particular, Micah 6:8. We will use the seemingly simple fundamentals of this verse to guide the ways in which we live out our call to be disciples of Jesus Christ.

Although the content is different from last year's Annual Report, this year's report is again organized by Micah's three-fold summary of God's expectations. Rather than attempting to enumerate everything we do at First Pres, this year's report highlights a few events that are representative of how we as a community walk the path Micah sets forth.

The Annual Report not only gives examples of how we have done justice, loved kindness, and walked humbly with God over the past year, but also serves to encourage us to continue our purpose and mission as a faith community in the coming year. Micah challenges us to keep questioning how will we work for fairness and equality for all, particularly the weak and powerless? How will we ensure love, loyalty, and faithfulness are the cornerstones of our relationships? How will we consider our life's journey with circumspect rather than with knee-jerk reactions? And how will we carefully put Christ first in all the moments of our lives?

DOJUSTICE

Preparations begin weeks before: the meal is planned, volunteers solicited, and the call for food donations is made. Then, in many different capacities, First Pres members come together to host the Thanksgiving

Meal, continuing this long-standing tradition of serving The Blue Ridge House, a rehabilitation center serving those recovering from the impact of mental illness.





Strengthening and building upon our already long-standing relationship with Habitat for Humanity, First Pres youth proudly make a commitment to regular build days-the first church in the area to begin a lasting relationship between youth and Habitat's service to the community.







More than twenty First Pres members gather on the Sanctuary steps prior to the July KKK Rally. Together, they walk to the Justice/Jackson Park, praying that love is stronger than hate. The racial events in our area challenge us to explore what it means to "stand firm in our pursuit of justice and the honoring of all peoples...united in our common humanity as beloved people of God."



LOVE KINDNESS

Twice a year, in a combined service at 10 o'clock, we welcome new members and confirmands into our congregation. Gathered on the lawn, we celebrate and eat together, learning about one another, becoming closer as a community, and building intergenerational relationships that can last a lifetime. This spring, we said goodbye and express our gratitude to Kendall Pearson after her long tenure with our youth.





For four weeks, people of all ages join together for a unique intergenerational class, exploring Advent through self-guided stations using scripture, crafts, and activities. Each week, energy and happiness permeate the rooms as members and families enjoy the time to connect with one another and learn together. Concluding the series, St. Nicholas makes a memorable visit, teaching children of all ages the historical account of Christmas.


